National Board Report

Music, Mountains and More was the theme of the NFMC Biennial Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah, on June 24-July 1 at the downtown Radisson Hotel. Salt Lake City is in a valley surrounded by the Wasach Mountains. The hotel was within walking distance to Temple Square complex of beautiful Morman Church buildings. We attended with husband Malcolm and State President Jo Orr of Tupelo.

The music was as majestic as the surrounding mountains. An evening concert featured the music of Dr. Crawford Gates, renowned composer and symphony orchestra conductor. Dr. Gates conducted the Utah Brass Choir. The Sterling Singers performed his choral compositions and a premiere performance of Piano Sonata (inspired by the Seasons, op. 112) by Dr. Gates was presented. The Sonata was commissioned for this NFMC Biennial Convention by President Elizabeth Paris and will be published. The program was recorded and available on CD. Jo sang a beautiful aria, accompanied by Ben, at the Saturday night banquet. We couldn't have made it without the help of husband Malcolm and our very special angel sister Jimmie Walker from Dyersburg who organized decorations and flowers for each event. 


