Many of you know how busy we have been already, with a meeting of state chairmen at Millsaps College on June 27, an MFMC Board Meeting July 16 at French Camp, and five separate mailings to many of you. The Fall Board Meeting at the Tupelo Country Club had wonderful attendance, with 48 of you coming from as far north as Corinth and as far south as Magee. Harold Kay, a management consultant in Tupelo, left us all inspired with his presentation on "Strategic Planning" for the Federation and

our clubs. I have heard from many of you just how helpful the whole day was.

Isn't it God's grace that we can pause during this terrible aftermath of Hurricane Katrina's destructiveness and give thanks for our Federation's work and how music lifts us above the terrible reality of the storm's ravages?  - 3. Firing up our "creative juices" to inspire

even greater achievement within our Junior Music Clubs and the implementation of a state award for MFMC "Junior Counselor of the Year" for 2005–2006.

- 4. Stronger emphasis on Music Education in general throughout the state.
- 5. More local autonomy for individual music clubs—if a club wants to meet quarterly, instead of monthly, for example, that will be acceptable.
- 6. We need to stress what is worthwhile about being in a music club. What sets us apart from other organizations? Remember, exposing our neighbors to art music offers them an opportunity to develop an understanding that there is more to life than "rap, rock and redneck."
- 7. Our last objective will be trying to reactivate clubs in Meridian, Laurel, Hattiesburg, and possibly the Gulf Coast area.

The challenge is to work toward our "promising future" without letting our "proud heritage" hold us back. Won't you join me in this exciting venture?

Junior News

Here are some helpful hints from your MFMC State Junior Counselor, Terri Donald:

- 1. It is required that a Junior Counselor and/or Teacher be a member of an Active Senior Music Club, or be an Individual Senior Special Member of the state and national federation.
- 2. Every teacher entering a student in Junior Festivals will be required to subscribe to the <u>Junior Keynotes</u> magazine.
- 3. Junior Clubs must send their treasurer's report and membership roll to the MFMC Treasurer, Cecil Fox, Jr., no later than December 1. If dues are not paid by February 1, clubs are considered de-

linquent and members are not eligible to participate in Junior Festivals. A late fee will also be applied.

- 4. Two helpful books for Junior Counselors are the <u>Junior Counselor's Handbook</u> and <u>Festivals Bulletin</u>. These can be ordered from the NFMC Headquarters.
- 5. If you are a new Junior Counselor for 2005–2006, please send your name, your club name, and your address to the MFMC State Junior Counselor, Terri Donald.
- 6. If you have co-counselors for your club, please share information that is mailed to you with them. The MFMC State Junior Counselor only has a list of the head Junior Counselor of each

club.

7. Junior Counselor Handbooks from the MFMC State Junior Counselor are mailed out in October every other year. During the off year, a supplemental handbook is mailed out.



Piano (2nd Place): Jacob Benda, Mississippi, Southeastern Region


Guitar (2nd Place): Thomas Flippin, Jr., Illinois, North Central Region

NFMC Outstanding Junior Counselor of the Year


